Patient Information

You are not alone.

You are not forgotten.

We know you have been through hard times and want you to know we understand. Everything we do we do for our patients. RAM strives each day to build more effective processes and maximize our resources and personnel to help as many people as possible. We care about you. We want you to have access to quality healthcare so you can live a thriving life. We know that many people can't afford healthcare so our clinics are free. If you are someone who is planning on attending a RAM Clinic below provides additional information and tips to help you:

SERVICES OFFERED

Most RAM Clinics basic services will offer dental, vision, general medical, prevention and education by licensed healthcare professionals. Additional services may be provided and will be indicated on specific dates on the clinic schedule.

Due to the lack of time each patient must choose between dental/medical or vision/medical. No patient will be allowed to register for dental and vision on the same day of service. The basic services can include:

DENTAL

Cleaning, Fillings, Extractions

VISION

Complete dilated eye exams, glaucoma testing, diabetic retinopathy, glasses made on site; want to save time? Bring your current eye glass prescription (within 1 year) to avoid an eye exam.

MEDICAL

General Medicine

PREVENTION

Breast Exams, Diabetes Screening, Physicals, Women Health

EDUCATION

Educational guidance and information will be given throughout the clinic and within specific service areas

WHO WILL BE SEEN?

The parking lot at the clinic site will open at 12 midnight and we will begin handing out numbers at 3 a.m.

Only one number will be given to each person and you must be present to receive a number.

The amount of numbers we hand out is based on the number of healthcare professionals that are gracious enough to provide free services.

So, once numbers run out, no other numbers will be issued for that day of service.

Only those who have a number will be allowed to enter the clinic service areas (Unless assisting another patient) and not everyone will receive a number.

Because the clinic is an event we have a start and ending time.

Those who do not receive a number may return another day or if there is no other day available will not be able to be seen.

We can not guarantee that if you come to wait for a number that you will receive a number to be seen. It is first come, first served.

WHAT HAPPENS ONCE I ENTER THE CLINIC?

Starting at 5:30 a.m. patients with numbers will be let into the clinic area in small groups to register.

No ID or payment of any kind is required for registration and services.

Because of the large number of patients seen each day, you should determine what your greatest need is dental or vision.

Everyone will be able to register for general medical and one other service (vision/dental).

Once registered, patients will go through several smaller waiting areas to be processed and enter service areas.

Every patient will enter the triage area where medical history can be completed prior to service.

After the triage area the patients will then enter the service areas that they have registered.

Depending on the service area will depend on the specific processing.

After you have received services then you will go to an exit station where your forms and services will be

reviewed.

You will be either directed to the next service area or exit of the clinic.

WHAT TO BRING

As you can see, it may be a very long day for you and/or your family, and your comfort is your responsibility.

We suggest the following: You should bring some food and beverages.

This could consist of breakfast, lunch, snacks, and water. Wear comfortable clothing.

Until you enter the building or clinic area you will need to endure the weather conditions. You can type in the zip code in the weather tool below to get the up to date local weather for your clinic site. Please check the weather prior to travel to make sure you are prepared for the elements...dress accordingly.
